## **Associated Learning Concepts: (Sexism and Gender)**

**Gender:** "Either of the two sexes (male and female), especially when considered with reference to social and cultural differences rather than biological ones. The term is also used more broadly to denote a range of identities that do not correspond to established ideas of male and female." In this presentation, gender is specifically fixated on female/woman. To talk about Masculinity, Misogyny, gender equality in the workplace, as well as women being shown in popular culture.

**Sexism:** "prejudice, stereotyping, or discrimination, typically against women, on the basis of sex." In this presentation, sexism is talked through almost every topic, such as the difference between men and women in the home, sexual violence.
